The ATOZ Foundation will sponsor 7 new educational and social projects.

Thanks to a 150.000€ grant from the ATOZ Foundation, under the aegis of the Fondation de Luxembourg, all 6 projects presented to the committee will have the chance to see the light of day.

Since its creation in 2012, the ATOZ Foundation has sponsored three different types of projects. They have chosen to focus on projects promoting education, research and social cohesion.

Among the many projects sponsored by the foundation, some are distinctly innovative: educating young girls in Cambodia at the Happy Chandara School, researching cures for degenerative neurological diseases at the Luxembourg Centre for Systems Biomedicine (LSCB), helping children with autism to learn and grow with the organization Ouest 22, improving the quality of life for foster children and children living in group homes, and lastly, raising awareness of cultural diversity and living conditions throughout the world.

On Monday, 30 June, all projects including the Association Etape, Autisme Ouest 22, the Association de Soutien aux Travailleurs Immigrés, the project Comenius from the private school Marie Consolatrice, the project Chemin de l'école, the LSCB, and the project Toutes à l'école presented their work to the ATOZ Foundation. They were then awarded more than 150.000€ in grants to help them kick-start their projects and accomplish their goals of education and research. Symbolic cheques were distributed during the presentations and a cocktail in honour of the project leaders and their hard work was served following the ceremony.
